





Girafon vivait avec Maman Girafe dans une petite maison.






Maman Girafe travaillait dans une orangeraie.




Les oranges étaient utilisées pour faire de la marmelade à la boulangerie de M. Ours.



Maman Girafe travaillait péniblement sous la chaleur écrasante du soleil.



Une table, une chaise. Une table, une chaise. Il commença à monter. Il allait de plus en plus haut...





Incroyable ! Le soleil ressemblait à une orange !




Girafon eut une idée.


Il ouvrit grand la bouche.

La pain cuit se mit à aller de plus en plus haut.


Où allait-il comme ça?
