








# La petite souris voulait aider Éric.


## Elle décida donc de lui fabriquer une chemise.

— Ne t'inquiète pas, mon ami qui pique, lui dit la petite souris. J'ai une autre idée.




— Que fais-tu ? interrogea Éric.
— Attends, tu vas voir, répondit la petite souris.




— Et maintenant, allons voir les autres animaux ! proposa la petite souris. Éric avait hâte de leur montrer ses nouveaux piquants.
