Les **hippopotames** aiguisent leurs dents en les frottant les unes contre les autres en permanence.

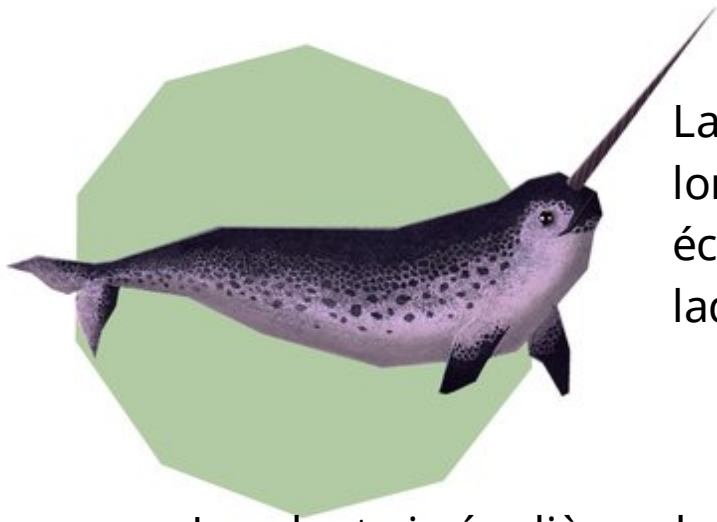


Les **tigres** possèdent des dents très solides qui leur permettent de maintenir fermement leurs proies.

L'émail des dents des **castors** contient du fer, ce qui leur donne leur couleur orange et les rend très solides.

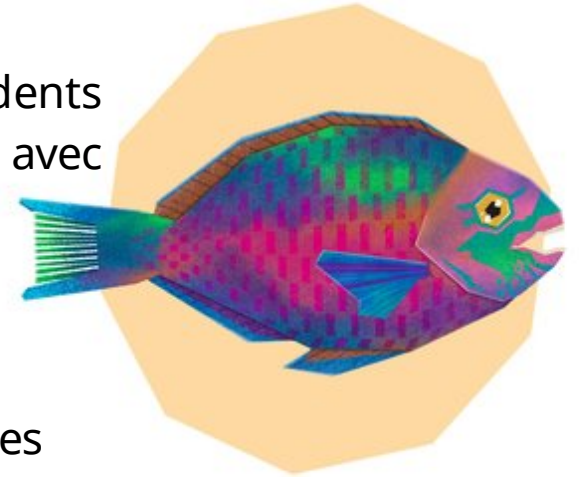
Les dents des **écureuils** poussent en permanence, ce qui est très utile puisqu'ils passent leur temps à ronger.
