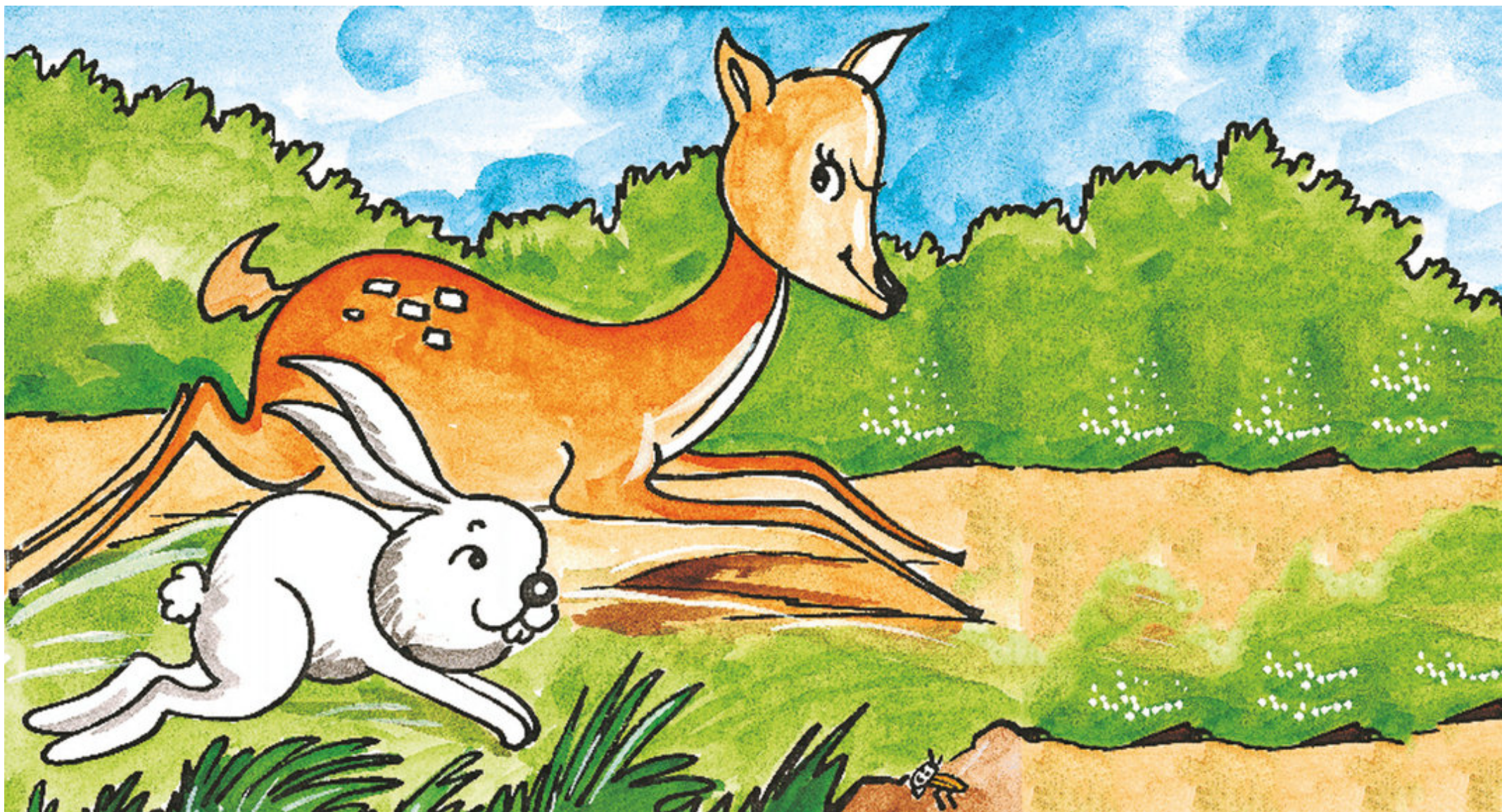

Un faon faisait la course dans la forêt.



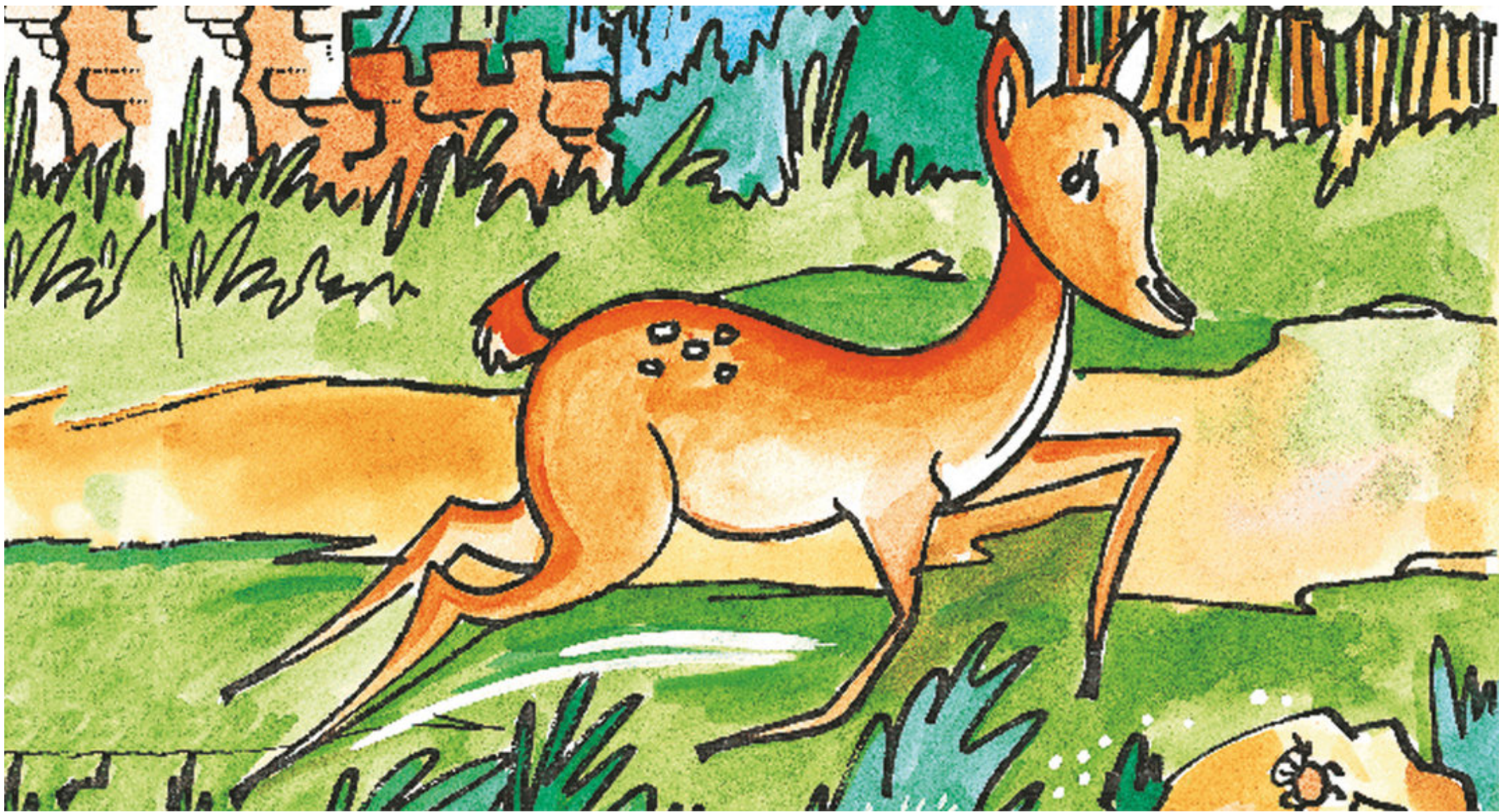
Il courait plus vite que le lapin.



Il courait plus vite que l'éléphant.



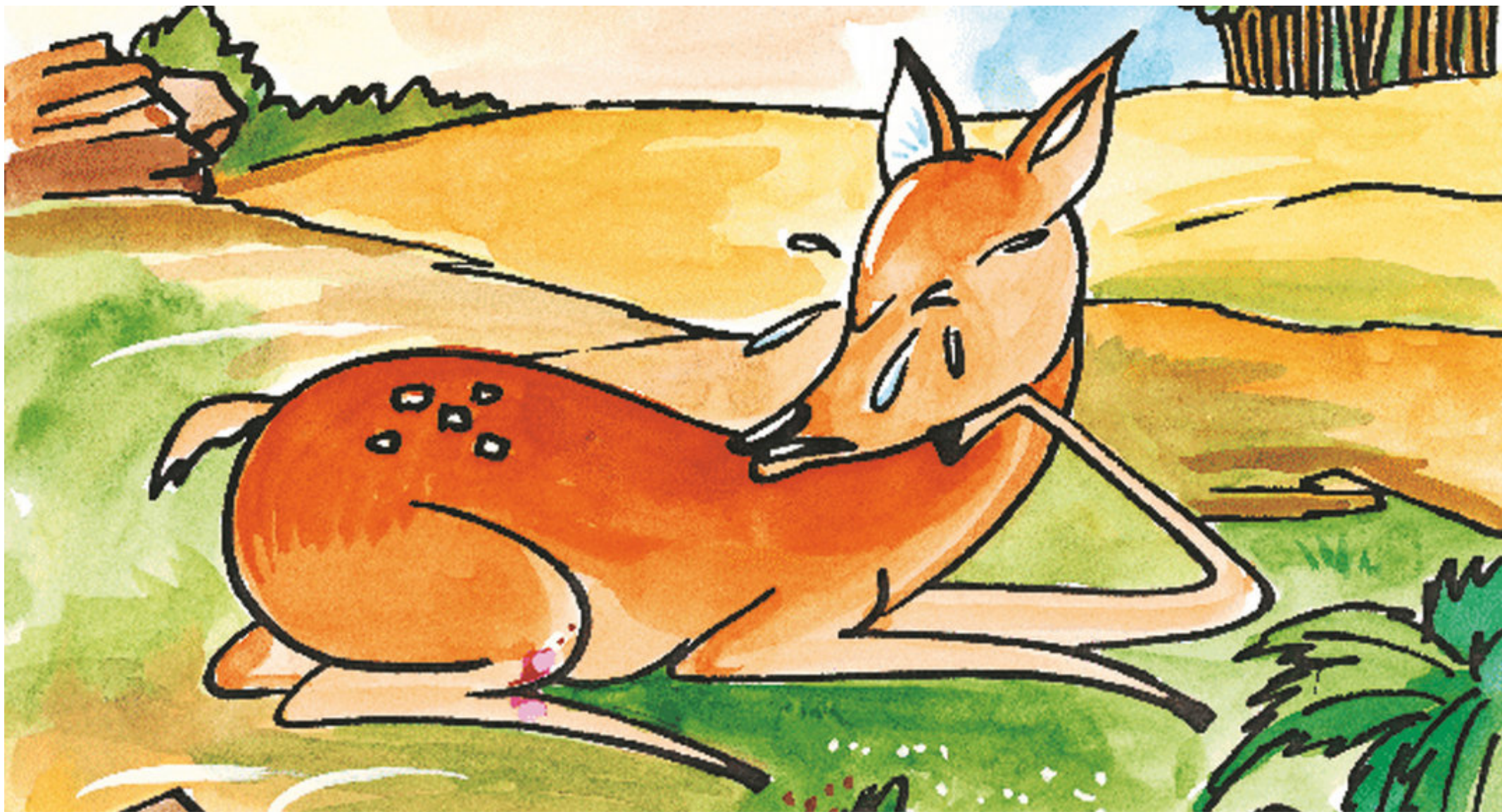
Il prit son élan et sauta par-dessus le ruisseau.

Sa mère se mit à rire. Le faon l'imita.

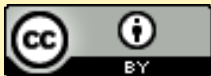
