
La terre était très sèche.




Un singe décida de partir à la recherche d'eau et de nourriture.




Il parcourut des vallées et gravit des collines.



Et finit par arriver dans un endroit appelé Tirkol.




Le singe fut très heureux dans cet endroit.



Il mangeait des fruits et prenait du poids.


