Mes poches sont pleines à craquer quand nous rentrons de promenade avec Tata.




Aujourd'hui, Mamie m'a donné une gousse de haricot.



Mon grand frère Dilip m'a donné une pince provenant de sa boutique pleine de trésors.




Ma grande sœur Nirmal m'a donné cet autocollant parce que j'avais attendu très sagement et très longtemps.
