
Le serpent de mer conduisit Khan jusqu'à un rocher. « Mon œuf est coincé dans ce gros rocher, » lui expliqua-t-il.






Arrivés sur place, ils poussèrent le rocher de toutes leurs forces.




Leurs efforts furent récompensés. Le rocher bougea enfin et Khan y découvrit le précieux œuf du serpent de mer.




Il glissa sa main à l'intérieur du rocher et récupéra l'œuf, en faisant bien attention de ne pas l'abîmer.




