







Il y a longtemps, un lion, un renard, un singe et une hyène vivaient ensemble.




Le singe et la hyène préparaient quelque chose contre le renard.

Ils allèrent à la rencontre du lion.




Le singe demanda au lion :

"Le renard peut faire des chaussures pour toi si tu veux", dit la hyène.




"Appelle le renard", dit le lion.

Le lion dit:


"Je veux les meilleures chaussures."

Il mit les peaux dans la rivière.




Le lion devint impatient.
